BLESSING

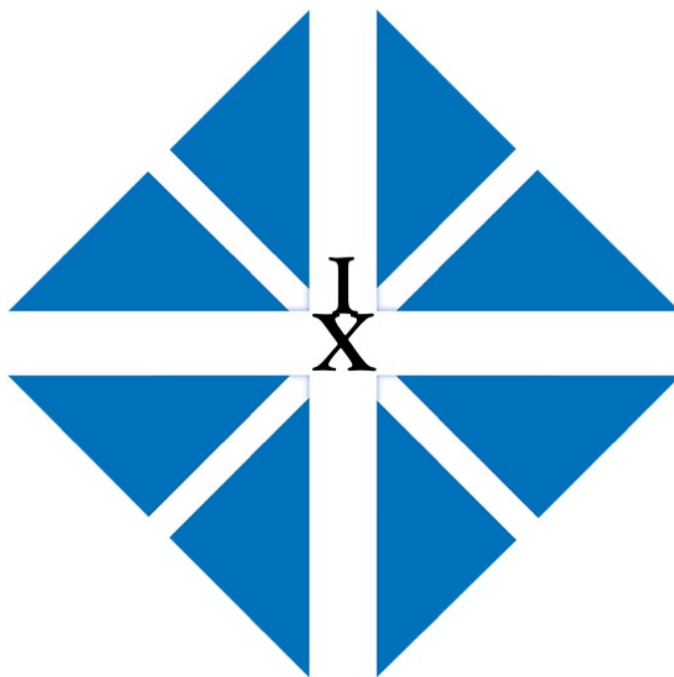
